#### Contact the

agency/attorney who is assisting you with the filing of the Protective Order before your court date to:

- Inform them if the Respondent has bothered you in any way since you last spoke to them.
- Request that an advocate accompany you to court (if you wish it).
- Inform them if any of your addresses have changed.

## THE DAY OF COURT:

Find a quiet place to sit down and set up your device. You will need to be alone.

Log into the Zoom meeting 15minutes early to make sure your device is working correctly. Make sure you sign in using your full legal name. You will be placed in a waiting room.

Mute yourself when you are admitted in the courtroom and pay attention to the Judge's instructions.

### One of the following could take place with your case:

DEFAULT HEARING:
This means that

show up to court.
You will have a
hearing in front of
the judge. The judge
will decide on
whether you are
granted a protective
order.

CONTESTED HEARING:
The Respondent is not

attorney representing
him/her) may ask you
questions. The Judge
will decide whether
you are granted a
protective order.

AGREEMENT:
The Respondent
has agreed to
the protective
order being in
effect. There will
be a short
hearing in front
of the Judge to
enter the agreed
protective
officially on the
court's record.
